The District Supports a Regional Tax to Help Fund Metro:

As you are aware, Metro has been suffering from years of under funding which has plagued the system with safety and reliability issues. Regional leaders from the District, Maryland and Virginia have agreed to support a dedicated tax for the additional funding. However, there is disagreement as to how the tax should be applied.

The District supports a regional, uniform, tax that each jurisdiction would charge - estimated to be a 3/4¢ increase in the sales tax that is paid by every resident, business, and visitor in the region. This uniform tax would be borne equally by everybody.

However, opponents of the regional tax feel that District residents and businesses should pay approximately three times more than residents and businesses in Virginia; Maryland residents and businesses would pay double of those in Virginia. They argue that the tax should be applied according to the current funding formula (the District pays 37.2%, Maryland pays 34.8%, and Northern Virginia jurisdictions pay 28 %). This proposal would drastically increase the District's sales tax and would be unfair to the District and place it at a competitive disadvantage with its regional partners.

HAWDC attended a meeting with Chairman Phil Mendelson, the key proponent arguing in support of the regional tax on the District's behalf, to discuss the regional tax. Chairman Mendelson continues to express to the regional partners the competitive burden that a non-regional tax places on District businesses and residents. Negotiations are still going forward and HAWDC will update Members when the jurisdictions come to a consensus.
