DC to Lift Stay-at-Home Order on Friday, May 29th

Barring any spikes in new COVID-19 cases, the District could begin a phased reopening on Friday, May 29th. The Public Health and gatherings of more than 10 people will still be prohibited. Face masks must still be worn in public.

Hotels

Open with safeguards

- Limited access to hotel common areas.
- Reduction in guest services to check-in/check-out only, no visitors other than guests in room, no valet parking.
- Elimination of non-essential amenities.
- No daily housekeeping offered under 7 days.
- Rooms to be cleaned, but not sold for 24 hours after guest departs.

Restaurants

Restaurants will be allowed to serve people at outdoor seating. Tables must be at least 6 feet apart and no more than six people can be seated at one table. Customers must be seated when they place orders and when they are served.

For restaurants that don't have outdoor seating areas, the city is working on "a process to reimagine sidewalks and roads," Mayor Bowser said.
